PUBLICATION ETHICS

SciTech Central Publications follow all ethical standards to make sure scholarly integrity, in a responsible manner, to maintain public trust in the research reported / published for public benefit and research development. SciTech Central Publications is striving to be member of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) and fully committed to abide by its Code of Conduct and ambitious to follow its Best Practice Guidelines.

AUTHORSHIP

Authorship refers to individual who has made considerable academic contributions to a scientific investigation. This include (a) contribution to the conception, design, execution of research, (c) participation in the analysis and interpretation of the data, (c) participation in drafting, reviewing and revising the manuscript for intellectual content and (d) approving the manuscript to be published.

Corresponding Author: If there are multiple authors in an article, one author should be designated as the correspondent author who assumes overall responsibility for the manuscript. The corresponding author may provide a significant contribution to the research effort and may not necessarily be the principal investigator or project leader.

Co-authors: All co-authors of a publication are responsible for providing consent authorship to the corresponding author, should have contributed satisfactorily into the research work to take responsibility for appropriate portions of the content, acknowledging that they have reviewed and approved the manuscript and are responsible for the content of all appropriate portions of the manuscript, including the integrity of research.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Authors may acknowledge those people who helped in research project, such as office staff, editorial assistants, Technical staff, financial agencies or other individuals in acknowledgement.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

A conflict of interest exists when judgement regarding the research is influenced by factors such as financial gain or personal relationships. All authors are required to disclose any financial, personal, or other associations that may influence or be perceived to influence, their work.

PLAGIARISM

SciTech Central Publications is committed to publish original and unpublished material to maintain the integrity of the scientific record. The corresponding author must affirm that all the other authors have read and approved of the manuscript. If editors found that an article plagiarized from a manuscript of some other researcher, authors will suffer plagiarism sanctions.



DUPLICATE SUBMISSION/PUBLICATION

Authors must give assurance that no part of manuscript reporting original work is being considered for publication in whole or in part elsewhere. Processing on manuscripts found to have been published elsewhere or under review will be suspended and authors will suffer sanctions.

CITATION MANIPULATION

Citation manipulation refers to publication of articles whose primary objective is to increase an author's number of citations. Authors who experience citation manipulation sanctions.

REDUNDANT PUBLICATIONS

Redundant publications refer to publishing the same intellectual material more than once, by the author. Authors of redundant publications will suffer publication sanctions.

SANCTIONS

In case of any complaint of misconduct, the journal will carry out an investigation following the COPE guidelines. All stakeholders will be given an opportunity to share their version. If the complaint raises valid concerns, the journal will follow sanctions on authors according to the severity of the breach.
